Bought vital fridge for neutering centre Novosibirsk to keep medicine and food.

Bought Micro chipping device for Chuguev, Ukraine

Social ad campaign in Moscow tube and on bus stops, which reached approximately 1 million people in 2 months.

Smaller social ad campaigns in 7 other cities

Medicine / anaesthesia supply for 9 cities.

Vladimir shelter - buying of humane catching equipment and neutering

Large Event for children in museum, exhibition on stray animals, teaching kindness and compassion. Multiple smaller events in various cities, homeless animals shows which helped to adapt many cats and dogs.

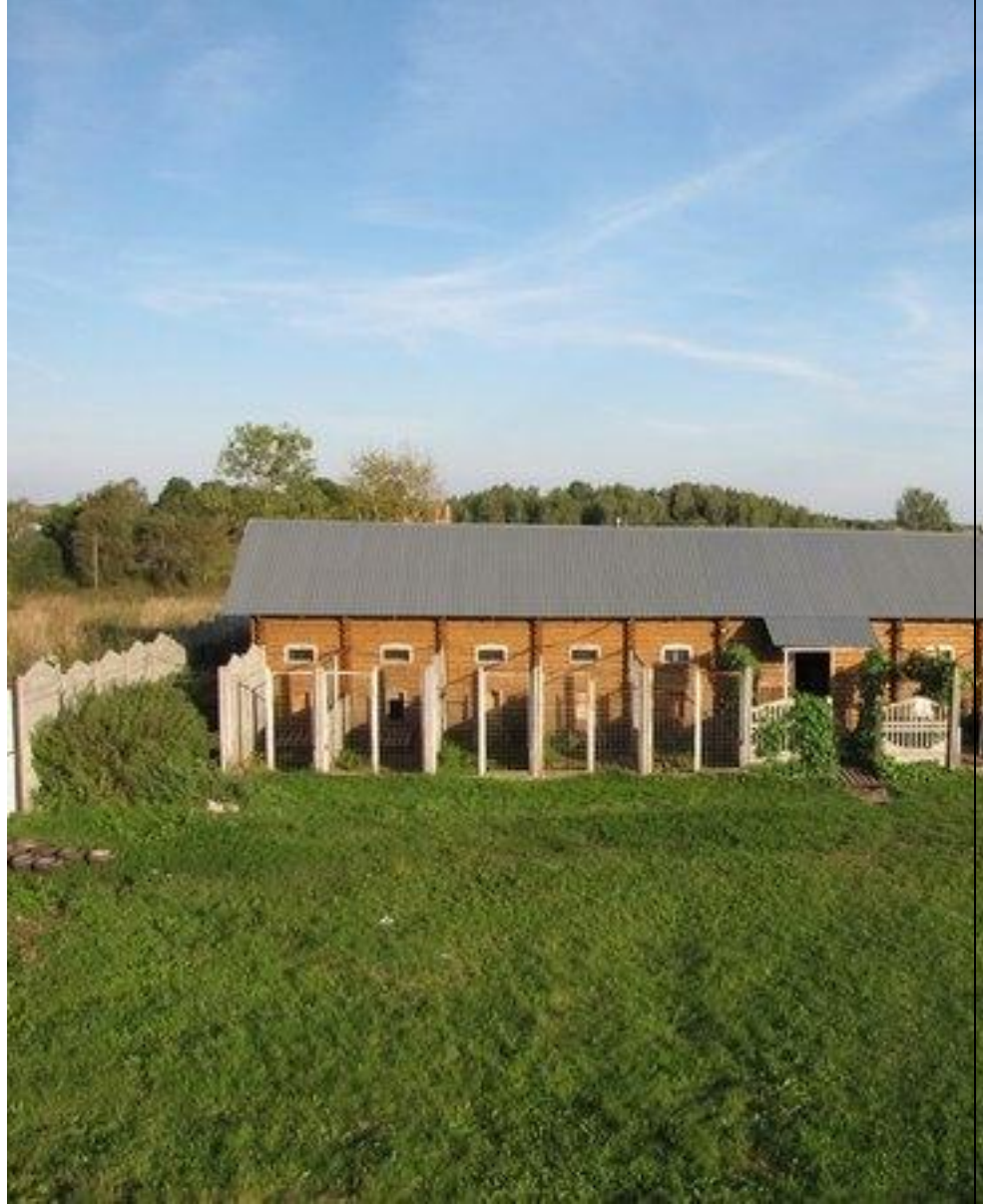
